## From Across the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents/Caregivers  
Kia ora tatou

As the final two weeks of the term have passed it has been an unusually quiet time in terms of activities for students. However, for the staff and senior students it has been a very hectic time with many students starting to prepare for their end of year assessments and also starting to plan for 2015.

By the time this newsletter goes home staff and students will be looking forward to a well earned break. For those students preparing for NCEA external assessments it is worth remembering that there are just four school weeks until these start. Now is the time to plan revision and study time, to avoid the last minute panic.

### **Education Review Office and Reflections.**

When school re-opens for Term 4, we are expecting a visit from the Education Review Office who will be in school from Monday 13 October until Wednesday 15 October. In preparation for this visit we have been reflecting upon the changes in the school during the last three years, since the last full review. As the Principal, I am extremely proud of the changes that have been made by both staff and students. The feedback I receive from our community has been overwhelmingly positive. Opihi College students continue to achieve to a very high standard academically and culturally. Feedback from parents tells us that students are enjoying being at Opihi College.

### **Course options**

Many of our students have been making course selections during the last few weeks. This information is now providing guidance to the timetable team who are starting on plans to create the timetable for 2015. Teachers and Deans will be starting discussions with students and offering advice and guidance with their course selection. Our aim is to ensure that students have the opportunity to achieve their goals and to ensure that they are successful as they move through the senior school and onto tertiary study or employment.

### **Staff changes**

Each year we see teachers and support staff come and go. This year is no different.

At the end of this term we say farewell to Mrs Jo Tarver who is returning with her family to live in the UK. Jo has worked at Opihi College for nearly ten years. She has been a wonderful asset for the school and has given much of her own time to coach basketball teams which have played in numerous tournaments in Timaru on a Friday night. We wish Jo and her family well for their return to the UK.

At the beginning of Term 4 we welcome Mrs Sharyn Patrick to our Support Staff. Mrs Patrick will be replacing Miss Cindy Coskerie in the front office. Cindy has moved down the corridor and is now our Executive Officer,

taking over from Mrs Noeline Clarke, who retired at the end of Term 3.

For next year we have recruited two new teachers to the school. We are looking forward to welcoming Miss Georgia Griffiths to the Maths Department in 2015. Miss Griffiths comes from Timaru and is not related to our other Mrs Griffiths!

We will also be welcoming Mrs Ashley Herbert to the Science Department who will be joining us from Botany Downs Secondary College. I am sure that the community will make both of these new teacher welcome when they arrive at Opihi College.

### **Report evening**

Last week many of teachers met with the parents and senior students to discuss the achievement and offer advice in the final stages of the school year. I hope that the senior students who attended have taken note of the advice that has been given and will work hard to ensure that they are successful.

### **Teacher Only Day**

Last week teaching staff benefitted from a Teacher Only Day which provided the opportunity to review courses and plan strategies for students in the last quarter of the school year. This was an opportunity to reflect upon the goals and targets which were set at the start of year and review the progress to maximise the chances of success.

### **TEZ**

On the 15<sup>th</sup> September Opihi College attended a meeting to discuss the Transport Entitlement Zone. Following the meeting a statement was issued which details the outcome. Below is a copy of the statement:

*A meeting has been held to discuss future options for providing secondary school transport to the greater Pleasant Point community. Represented at the meeting were the Ministry of Education, Opihi College, Aoraki Schools Transport Network, Geraldine High School, Mountainview High Schools and Timaru Boys and Girls High Schools. At this facilitated meeting an agreement was reached to form a working party to gather further data and to offer independent consultation with the Pleasant Point Community. This process is expected to be completed by mid-November with a recommendation made to the MoE.*

We will keep the Opihi College and wider Temuka Community informed as this situation develops.




