Aoraki Secondary School Cross Country

After rain interrupted the running of the Aoraki Cross Country event it was great that so many Opihi College students were able to participate and represent the school so well. For many of our students the change of course was a big surprise as they were faced with hills and a lot of off road, trail running. Rock Quest

School property

For the last twelve months Opihi College has been working closely with the Ministry of Education in reviewing and planning the development of the facilities at Opihi College. Whilst we are still working towards a final plan we are very optimistic that there will be some major property developments happening at the Opihi College site within the next couple of years. I hope to be able to confirm our plans and what the future may look like for the Opihi College site, before the end of the school year.

Innovative Learning Environments

With the plans for re-development of some of the school site there is a great deal of planning to be done for the future. As part of this, a group of teachers have taken over the library and are trialling teaching is an innovative learning environment. This two week trial will provide an insight into what it might be like to teach in a modern teaching space. There is much research and evidence to support the changes we will be looking to make in the future.

Changes to our curriculum

As well as reviewing our school site we are also in the process of reviewing our school curriculum. Our aim is to provide the opportunities to our students to enable them to transition from Opihi College to employment, training or tertiary study. The future for our students is looking very promising as we review what we have offered in the past and see how that will fit in the future needs and expectations for our students. This year we offered, for the first time, Agriculture to our students as well as the opportunity to study part time at Aoraki Polytechnic. With the review of the curriculum we are also reviewing how we deliver our programmes to enable students to develop the skills that they need for the future. This project is on going and staff are involved in research as to the best models that are in use and how they can be made to work for Opihi College and for the benefit of our students.

With so many projects under way we believe that we are planning for the future of our students and endeavouring to provide the best possible opportunities to them now and in the future. We hope that you will join us and provide your thoughts as to how we can provide the best opportunities to our students.
