#### From Across the Principal's Desk



Dear Parents / Caregivers,

#### Kia ora tatou

The school term is moving along very fast and we have recently farewelled many of the senior students who have started their study leave as they have gained the necessary credits to attain their NCEA certificate. Some of these students have no external exams and have either opted to continue with their studies or take on some paid work.

This week I was talking to one young man who not only has his NCEA Level 1 certificate but is just 20 credits short of his NCEA Level 2 as he finished his Year 11 courses. He was looking forward to working although he admitted he hated the job. He then went on to say that he was going to continue on in this work rather than return for Year 12.

I took the time to talk to him about the opportunities that would be available to him for Year 12. This included returning and taking one of the Vocational Pathway courses, possibly a work experience and completing the missing 20 credits for his Level 2. Ideally he would work toward a V Path Endorsement. We talked about a similar young man who has just finished Year 12 and who did precisely the same. He now has two tutors at Aoraki Polytechnic who both want him in their course for 2016. This young man, because he stayed in school to complete some additional studies now has great opportunities ahead of him.

The discussion I had with the Year 11 student made him stop and think. He now knows that he could be in the same position. If he opts to return, as I hope he does, his earning power would be far greater and he would have more career opportunities than he currently imagines.

#### Sport, Cultural and Special Awards

On Monday 2 November we held our Sport, Cultural and Special Awards assembly. It was really pleasing to see so many parents and whanau attend. I was impressed by the number of students who walked across the stage having been recognised for their achievement. As I said at the event, the range of activities that are offered is as a result of the special contribution of the volunteer coaches, managers and supporters. These are not just teaching staff but also parents, members of our wider community and also some of our senior students who are passionate about the school and want to invest in the future of this school and wider community. I appreciate the hard work of all these individuals. Senior departure

For the seniors who have departed I have talked about their responsibilities whilst they are out of school. I have also placed upon them very clear expectations for what they should be doing. I expect that they will continue to behave and represent Opihi College with pride.

For students who have not gained study leave, they are expected to attend school as normal, in full school uniform. They will be working to gain the final credits that are necessary for them to achieve their NCEA certificate.

For students who do have study leave and would like to have assistance from their subject teacher they may attend school in mufti and arrive and depart at times that suit their needs. However, we do ask that students make sure that they sign in at the front office so that we know that they are on site.

#### **NCEA Exams**

NCEA Exams start next week. Once again we will be providing 'brain food' in the half hour prior to the exam. This is not a full meal but a light snack to set students up for their exam. We encourage students to take advantage of this offer. All students have been informed of the expectations during the exams. These expectations are set down by NZQA. We wish all students every success in their exams and their results are a reflection upon the time and effort that they have put into their studies during the school year.

#### Have a go Sailing

In the first week of the summer holiday, students from Year 7 to 9 have the opportunity to try sailing for a day. Letters have been distributed to interested students. This is a great opportunity to try a new sport at a very cheap price. I encourage students to get involved and 'Have a Go!'

#### STUDENT EXCHANGE Between Timaru and Eniwa, Japan



Sister Cities Timaru invites applications from Secondary School Students to represent the Timaru District on an escorted Educational and Cultural Exchange to Eniwa Hokkaido, Japan. The exchange visit is planned for late June 2016 and will be for three weeks, three students will be chosen.

A short essay (of between 150-200 words) stating "Why I would make a good representative of my District" should accompany the application and a current photo.

Applicants will need a current passport and preferably need to reside and attend a High School in the Timaru District. Accommodation would be free. Students will be home hosted and possibly by the Japanese families of Eniwa students who recently visited Timaru.

Approximate airfare cost to the student \$3,000 + taxes and optional personal spending (\$200-500).

Students shortlisted will be contacted by the Sister City committee for an Interview in mid December 2015. Whilst a knowledge of Japanese language and culture is not a pre-requisite, an affinity with Japanese culture could be an advantage.
