Uniform Changes 2016

As part of the uniform review process we have now finalised changes that will become effective starting January 2016. We had initially hoped these changes were at least a year away, but due to being informed of the unavailability of the check fabric, we have had to implement these changes sooner.

There are now 2 options of summer skirts available; the existing blue and white check skirt, available from The Drapery or second hand, **or** a navy inverted pleat skirt which is available online from The Warehouse (prices starting from \$33). The address is <u>www.schooltex.co.nz</u> and the style code is 36278. Please note this new navy skirt from the Warehouse can be worn from Years 7-13.

The existing junior blue and white check skirt and senior navy skirt are slowly being phased out over a number of years. We do not expect you to go and buy a new skirt until your existing one needs replacing.


