It was great to see our learners arrive refreshed after their extended Easter break. The end of the term is often the part where

Year 13 Uniform

The Board of Trustees met last week, during the meeting they accepted a proposal from our current Year 13 learners to continue with school uniform in Term 4, where we have normally granted mufti. The Year 13s put forward a motion to the board which included very sensible reasoning around their request to remain in school uniform (except for Term 4 Dress-Down Fridays). They felt that the additional pressure on families to buy more clothes, and on them to be distracted from their in-school performance would be better managed by remaining in uniform. The Board supports their decision for 2016 and beyond.

Year 12 and 13 Upcoming Leadership Events




