Dear Parents/Caregivers

I hope you all had a chance to spend some time with your children in the holidays and that you enjoyed those family moments. I know that many of our senior students will have been working on assessments and revision during the break and am sure that those efforts will pay off in their NCEA results for the year. We (and I'm sure your children too) appreciate the time that you put into supporting them with their work and helping them to manage their time wisely, especially at this time of the year.

NCEA exams

The fourth term means the culmination of NCEA studies. For many students this will include external assessments. These are due to start on Friday 10th November with NCEA. Some students will be released from 2nd November for study leave. Those who are not released must be at school each day as they have work to complete for their internal standards. For all senior students, staff will be available to assist with last minute tuition and support right up until the end of the school year. However, it is important that students plan those times with their teachers as this is a busy time for all staff with camps and trips out of school.

Hello, my name is Eddy Duan and I would like to say thank-you and goodbye to Temuka.

I'm from Japan, and I have been here in Temuka since this February studying at Opihi College as an international



student. I have had really precious experiences and have been inspired and impressed. When I arrived in NZ my favourite things about NZ were the clean air, nature, and the bright sunshine... but now, my favourite things are fish and chips, NZ butter, NZ chocolate, and the kiwi people.

Firstly, I would like to thank my host family, the Edgler family, who have given me the most wonderful kiwi experiences like fishing, camping and changing babies' nappies—that was quite amazing but once is enough. Also my host father, Kirk, let me design the logo for his Rock Band, Sons of Remo. It was very challenging, but so much fun.

Secondly, I would like to thank all of Opihi College students and teachers. I will never forget that I have been part of the Opihi College whanau. There were so many activities available, and I have had so many different experiences like... the ball-Beautiful, the 40 hour famine-fruitful, and skiing-painful. So, the words from my Japanese teacher, "momo-o-tore" means try everything. Don't let opportunities just float by, but grab them. The words actually made me braver, and let me gain a lot of great things while I have been in NZ.
