## From Across the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents/Caregivers

It's almost scary the way this school term is passing so

rapidly. We have recently farewelled many of the senior students. Those students who have gained the necessary credits to attain their NCEA certificate, or who have external exams that will allow them to pass, have started their study leave. The students who still have internal assessments to complete are remaining at school until they have gained the credits that are available to them. If your student has been granted leave, and is sitting external exams, we appreciate your support in helping them to maintain a study schedule.

#### **Sport and Cultural Awards**

On Wednesday 2nd November we held our Sport and Cultural Awards assembly. It was really pleasing to see so many parents and whanau attend. This was my first Opihi Awards Ceremony and I was impressed by the number of students who were being recognised for their achievement.

In my opening talk I pointed out that it is because of the volunteer coaches, leaders and managers that these students are able to participate in the huge range of activities that are available to them at Opihi College. The level of contribution that staff, parents and community members make towards the wide range of sporting and cultural activities we offer shows how passionate we all are about student participation. To me it sends the message that we all believe that investing time into our youth is the great way we can help ensure their positive futures. I know I said this on Wednesday afternoon, but it is well worth me repeating how much we appreciate all of the time and energy that staff and community offer to support sport and cultural activities.

It has been made clear to seniors who have departed what our expectations of them are. I expect that they will continue to behave and represent Opihi College with pride. For students who have not gained study leave, they are expected to attend school as normal, in full school uniform. They will be working to gain the final credits that are necessary for them to achieve their NCEA certificate. Any students who do have study leave but would like to have assistance from their subject teacher may attend school and arrive and depart at times that suit their needs and the availability of their teachers. However, we do ask that students make sure that they sign in at the front office so that we know that they are on site.

#### **NCEA Exams**

NCEA Exams start next week. All students have been informed of the expectations during the exams. These expectations are set down by NZQA. We have also reminded students that Year 11's and 12's must attend exams in full uniform. Year 13's may wear appropriate mufti.

We wish all students every success in their exams and believe their results will be a reflection upon the time and effort that they have put into their studies during the school year.

#### **Awards Night**

Wednesday 7th December is the night of our annual Awards Ceremony; our celebration of student academic success. As I advised in our last newsletter, students will attend school in the morning and then be released to go home in the afternoon.

The 'free' afternoon is in lieu of attending in the evening. All students are expected to attend the awards night unless the school receives a letter of explanation from the parent/caregiver prior to the event. Students who do not attend will be regarded as truant and will be expected to make up the time missed. Students attend in full uniform.

#### **Finally**

We are currently preparing for our Year 7 Raincliff camp which begins on the 29th November. I am looking forward to visiting the camp, as an opportunity to see our students taking on learning and challenges in a very different environment!

# "Tadaima! We're home!"

Tigerlily Doudle, Sheyanne McCarron, Hayley McLean, Liam Mulligan, Louise Rippin and teachers Eric Lindblom and Janine McIvor travelled to Japan for a two week language study trip during the Term 3 holidays. The journey began in Tokyo where they visited many places like Asakusa, Akihabara, Harajuku and Shibuya. They also took a bus ride out to Fujikyu Highland Amusement Park which is right next to Mt. Fuji. After a few days of Japanese life in the big city, they moved in with host families from Ikubunkan High School. This is the same school that Eddy Duan came from! They attended regular Year 11 classes and had some special lessons in Japanese calligraphy, tea ceremony and kendo. Then they jumped on the Shinkansen (bullet train) and travelled across the country at 260 km/h to Kanazawa and then Kyoto. From Kyoto they made day trips to the temples and shrines in Nara, to the Peace Park in Hiroshima and to a huge aquarium and shopping in Osaka. It was an amazing trip! Some new experiences for the students included navigating the Tokyo



subway and Kyoto bus system, bullet trains, Japanese vending machines, karaoke, sleeping on a futon on tatami mats, computerised toilets and all of the very different, but mostly delicious food that they tried. Though it was only a short two weeks in Japan the students' lives were greatly enriched. They grew in maturity and self-confidence and improved their communication skills. We are very grateful to the Sasakawa Fellowship Fund for Japanese Language Education and also the Temuka community who generously supported our many fundraising activities.



The Awarua Wetland

9-1pm

The Awarua wetland restoration is part of an ongoing project by Arowhenua to restore the natural flax-pukio wetland opposite the Marae.
