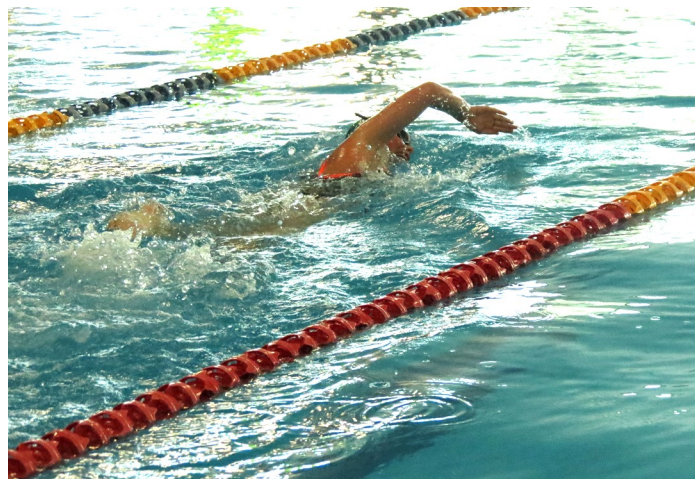

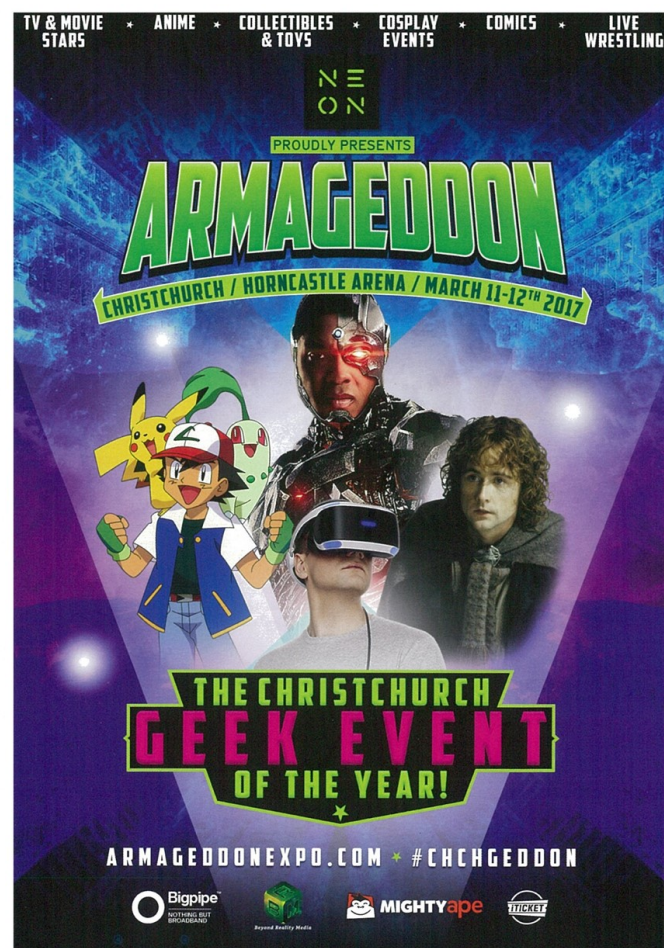

HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS (HPV) IMMUNISATION IN SCHOOLS 2017

Both boys and girls in Year 8 are the focus for the school based HPV Immunisation Programme. The vaccine for the school programme is HPV9 (Gardasil 9) which protects against nine types of HPV, compared with the previous vaccine which protects against four types of HPV. The five additional types included in the vaccine means that HPV Immunisation offers protection against a greater proportion of HPV-related cancers. Protecting young people before they have been exposed to HPV will better protect their health over the long term. From a practical point of view, for the students and their families, it is great that the change in vaccine means that now just two doses of HPV vaccine are required to fully protect young people aged 14 and under, rather than the previous three doses. The doses should be given about six months apart, and the proposed vaccination timetable for South Canterbury is: Dose one 20 March – 31 March 2017 and Dose two 18 – 29 September 2017

The most up to date information about the HPV Immunisation Programme can be found on the website www.health.govt.nz/hpv

The vaccine is SAFE, EFFECTIVE, FUNDED FOR BOTH BOYS AND GIRLS and AVAILABLE AT SCHOOL FOR YEAR 8 students. The doctor will provide immunisation for older students (both boys and girls) and it is free up to age 26 years. Please contact your doctor.

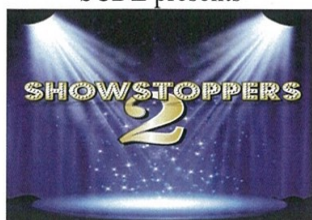
OPIHI COLLEGE HPV EDUCATION

Claire Neilson our school nurse will see Year 8 students for about 20mins in the library and show a short DVD presentation on HPV Immunisation on Thursday 2nd March. Parents can view this DVD on www.health.govt.nz

CONSENT FORMS will be given to each student to take home on this day. We ask for the forms to be filled out, signed and dated by the parent/legal caregiver and be returned to the school within one week of receiving them. A follow up phone call to parent/caregiver will be made if the form is not returned.

The date for immunisation at Opihi College for consenting students will be advised closer to the time.

What is the ANZ Olympic Schools Programme

ANZ has developed the ANZ Olympic Schools Programme with the New Zealand Olympic Committee to inspire and motivate New Zealand's youth, through the magic and celebration of the Olympic Games. Schools will be provided with resources and merchandise to provide opportunities, activities and incentives for students to live the Olympic Values. In addition to the great resources schools can receive, ANZ has also tailored the programme so their staff can personally help schools earn credits to spend at the ANZ Awards Centre and also secure the chance to have an Olympic Ambassador visit the school.

ANZ staff will be encouraging people within their school communities to support their school and come to ANZ for their next home loan. For every home loan drawn down a school can earn credits to spend on items from the ANZ Awards Centre, items such as sports equipment or computers. As an example an eligible home loan drawn down by someone linked to your school to the value of \$50k or more will entitle the school to 800 credits. 800 credits equates to approximately \$400 of spending power at the ANZ Awards centre.

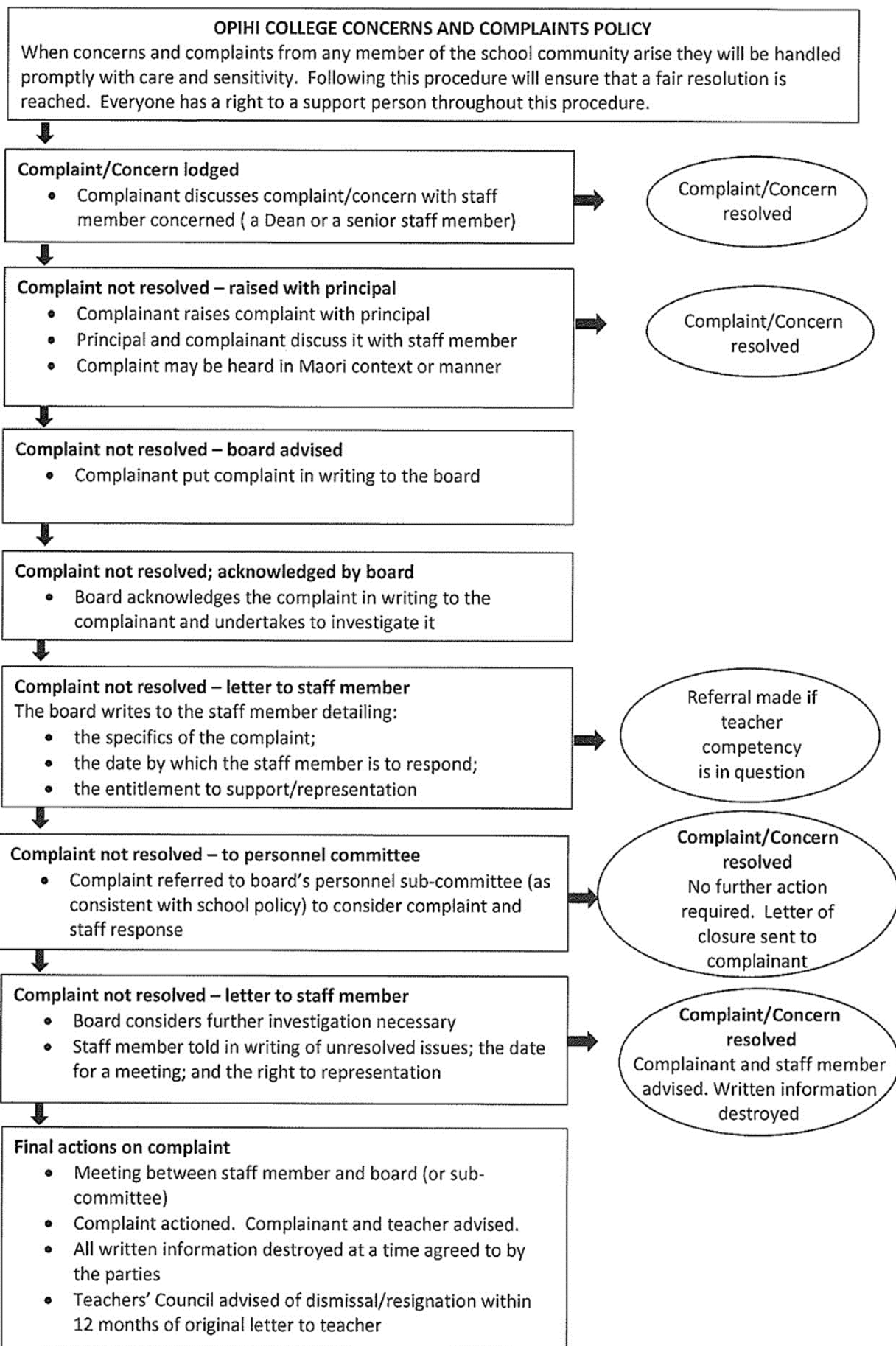
