









Dear Parents/Caregivers



At Opihi College, we strongly encourage our parents to enrol their child in the <u>Reading Plus</u> <u>program.</u> This is a web-based reading programme that helps students become stronger, more proficient and confident readers.

This program helps students to <u>read faster</u>, <u>recognise new words</u>, <u>and comprehend more of what they have read</u>; enabling them to read more easily <u>across all age levels</u>.

Here are some comments from our students who have used Reading Plus

'I like it because it's easier than reading a book.'

'I can read more fluently. When I first started I was falling behind and now I can keep up.'

'It is a fun way to improve my reading.'

'It tells you the percentage – if I get it wrong I am more careful.'

Reading Plus covers <u>all reading abilities</u> - it helps good readers become excellent readers. We have noticed a big jump in the reading confidence and ability of students using this program correctly. Students really seem to like the tracking of the programme; knowing that they need to consistently achieve an 80% pass rate before they move on to the next level is empowering for them. Reading Plus content goes all the way to Year 13. It is great for extending students.

Although we cover reading skills comprehensively in our class programme, we feel this web-based programme adds depth to a child's skill base, which is why we would like to see as many of our students participate in this program this year. The weekly assignments are completed for homework, with homeroom teacher monitoring and supporting. If you do not have the devices or internet at home, lessons can be completed at school.

The cost of this programme is \$40 per student (\$1 per week at school). Reading skills are so important for your child – every subject they take requires reading comprehension. Please consider this when making your decision. Our literacy teacher (Bridget Wilson) is happy to talk to any parent/caregiver who would like to find out more about this programme. 

Opihi College Uniform – School Regulations 2018 Junior Uniform (Years 7-10)

Tops

- Mid-blue polo shirt with school crest
- Dark Royal, V-necked, long sleeved jersey with school crest
- Dark Royal, V-necked, vest with school crest
- Black soft shell jacket with crest; or any plain black water resistant jacket.

Bottoms

- Navy blue (walk or ladies) shorts
- Inverted 2-pleat navy skirt
- Navy blue skort
- Long black dress trousers
- "Blue Watch" tartan kilt

Socks

- White turn over top ankle socks (not sports socks)
- Black turn over top ankle socks
- Black over the knee socks (to be worn with kilt/skirt only and must look like tights, therefore not visible as socks)
- School socks dark grey with black, blue and white hoop

Senior Uniform (Years 11-13)

Tops

- White straight hem, short sleeve, collar band, shirt
- White long sleeve, collar band shirt (must be tucked in)
- Dark Royal, V-necked, long sleeved jersey with school crest
- Dark Royal, V-necked, vest with school crest
- Black soft shell jacket with crest; or any plain black water resistant jacket.
- School blazer and tie (optional Year 11-12, compulsory in Year 13)

Bottoms

- Navy blue (walk or ladies) shorts
- Inverted pleat skirt navy
- Long black dress trousers
- "Blue Watch" tartan kilt

Socks

- White turn over top ankle socks (not sports socks)
- Black turn over top ankle socks (not sports socks)
- Black stockings
- Black over the knee socks (to be worn with kilt/skirt only and must look like tights, therefore not visible as socks)
- School socks dark grey with black, blue and white hoop

Please Note:

Slight modification to uniform guidelines regarding long black socks - effective Term 2

Uniform items are available from SchoolTex online, The Warehouse Timaru or the College Office.

Other items - Junior and Senior

- All students to wear black, <u>leather or leather look</u>, shoes of a plain design with enclosed toes.
 Shoes must be able to be polished, not suede or canvas. They must be shoes, not boots. They must comply with Health and Safety requirements for protection of the foot in technology and science areas.
- Students are strongly advised to wear a blue school bucket hat or school cap in Term 1 and Term 4. Both styles can be purchased from the school office.
- Plain navy blue or black beanies and scarves may be worn during Term 2 and 3.
- PE uniform Opihi College PE shirt with black shorts (mid-thigh maximum length and no cycle type shorts). A change of socks is to be worn with gym shoes. On cold days a black tracksuit or a plain coloured sweatshirt in your house colour and black track pants can be worn. (The P.E. shirts are only available to purchase through the school office.)













PERSONAL PRESENTATION – SCHOOL REGULATIONS

These regulations apply to all students.

- Hair must be clean, tidy (out of eyes) and tied up if longer than shoulder length. No extremes including changing hair to unnatural colours. Boys must be clean-shaven. Hair ties must be in school colours. (Blue, black, brown and white.)
- A Taonga or other item of religious or cultural significance may be worn inside clothing. It is to be removed for health and saftey reasons as required.
- Students may only wear <u>plain</u> silver or gold stud earrings in their ears at their own risk. No other jewellery should be visible. Facial piercing, nose studs, tongue piercing and visible tattoos are not permitted.
- Make-up and coloured nail polish are not to be worn with school uniform.

The school uniform is to be worn correctly and neatly at all times.
