This is our last newsletter for 2018.

We have all been so busy that I know our students are looking forward to the end of the school year and the opportunity for a little relaxation. This week we've had students attending Athletics sports and students away at Year 7 Camp. I had the privilege of popping up to camp a couple of times and I am seriously impressed at the opportunities the students have there. Everyone seemed to be having a great time – including the staff. Not even the rain was able to put a damper on their high spirits.

Buildings

I know I keep telling you that we are making progress towards our New Build project. And I keep being wrong as the goal posts and requirements we have to meet keep moving. However, I am assured by the Ministry of Education that they will be starting next week (once our students have finished) on the removal of asbestos from H Block, and then beginning the demolition in early 2019. We have our fingers crossed that this will actually happen!
