NZQA FEES

A reminder to all families of students in Year's 11 – 13 that NZQA fees will need to be paid by the beginning of September. The fee for Domestic students is \$76.70 unless you qualify for Financial Assistance which reduces it to \$20.

To be eligible for financial assistance, the applicant (normally the parent or guardian of the candidate) must be the feepayer and must apply under one of the following application types:

- * Benefit applications those receiving a Work and Income or Study Link Benefit
- * Income based applications Community Services Card Holders
- * Multiple Candidate Applications Where the total fees exceed \$200

To apply for Financial Assistance you must complete an Application Form, available through the School Office or online at www.nzga.govt.nz.




