CELLPHONE POLICY

Last year we implemented a change for students in regard to having cellphones at school. This will continue this year. The key points of our policy are:

- No cell phones are to be on the student while in the classroom.
- During class, cell phones are to be left in their bag, or placed in the cell phone holder, or given to the teacher to place in a locked drawer.
- If the students have a cell phone on them during class, we go onto a 3 strike system:
- * Strike 1 cell phone will be removed for the remainder of the day. The phone may be collected by the student at the end of the day.
- * Strike 2 cell phone will be removed for the remainder of the day. It is to be collected by a parent/caregiver from the office.
- * Strike 3 cell phone will be removed until a meeting is held with a parent/caregiver and a plan is in place regarding cell phone at school.

REPORTING AND CONFERENCING

We issue a newsletter every two weeks. These are sent out electronically, though families can request a paper copy. The newsletters are also published on our school website. If you wish to receive a paper copy of the newsletter each fortnight, please return the slip on the front of this newsletter or contact the school office.

PORTAL

You can access the portal via our school website – www.opihicollege.school.nz. The login section is at the bottom of the page. Students and parents have separate logins, as parents can view other information like financial sections that students cannot. All parents will be sent an email with their log in details. The portal is great for checking attendance, timetables, notices, academic results, school calendar and other important information.

COMMUNICATING WITH TEACHERS

We understand that at times all parents/caregivers,or students, have questions for teachers. We ask that you please refrain from privately messaging teachers via messenger etc. Every teacher and support staff member has a school email address that you can use. These email addresses are listed on our school website.

SCHOOL ACCESS

With the new construction work continuing this year, it means that we have a large portion of the school still cordoned off. The front office is still accessible from the western entrance on Richard Pearse Drive, however people can no longer access the whole school from this entrance. Therefore, students must enter and exit through the eastern most entrance point on Richard Pearse Drive. We have asked students that bike or scooter to walk their bikes and scooters down this driveway for safety reasons. When leaving school, students will go down the footpath (not across the grass) to the pedestrian crossing to cross the road (if needed).

No students are allowed to enter or exit the school from the Guild Road gates.

Currently we have stocks of both new and pre-loved PE tops. New PE Tops are \$40 (black with white piping style) or \$50 (black with white collar style). In the event of not having the size you prefer in stock, we can order for you.

LUNCHES

We are happy to provide school lunches during 2021 for all students. The menus will be published prior to the week. These lunches are completely optional and you are more than welcome to continue providing your child/ren with their own packed lunch, or alternatively, our canteen is continuing to operate as well. Families will need to provide morning tea.

LUNCH AND TRANSPORT PASSES

If your child wishes to go home for lunch, they need to fill in a lunch pass application form. These are available from the office and need to be completed each year.

Also, if your child wishes to bring a vehicle to school, they need to fill in a transport form. These are available from the office too.

LATENESS

Every student must be at school by 8:40am when the bell for Whanau goes. This then gives them time to be in class which starts at 8:45am. If for any reason your child is late, they need to come to the office with a note and sign in.

ABSENCES

If your child is absent for the day, please leave a message on our absence line as early as possible. A message can be left on the message line during out of hours times.

APPOINTMENTS

If your child needs to leave school during the day for an appointment, a parent or caregiver must ring the office to notify them of that appointment, or send a signed note to school with your child. A text message via your child's phone is not acceptable, as we are unable to verify its authenticity.

SICK BAY

If your child becomes unwell during the day, they are to come to the school office to be cared for in the sick bay. If necessary, the office staff will then contact parents/caregivers if required. Please remind your child to follow these procedures, rather than texting parents themselves or just leaving.

UNIFORM

If your child for any reason is wearing the incorrect uniform, they are to present a signed note from a parent/caregiver to their Dean as soon as they arrive at school. Otherwise feel free to contact your child's Dean regarding any other uniform issues.
