Welcome Back!

I would like to extend my gratitude to everyone who has played their part over the last 3 weeks while our region has been in Alert Level 4 and 3. Lockdowns are a challenging time for families, and we really appreciate all the hard work that has gone into keeping our young people safe. Thank you very much to the teachers and staff at Opihi, who have worked hard by preparing work (both online and hardpack), teaching remotely, making countless deliveries and staying in regular contact with families. Last Thursday saw the long awaited return of all students to school. It is now a good time to remind everyone that we need students at school by 8:40am in their correct

school uniform. With only 10 school days until the October holidays, our teachers need to make the most of all possible teaching time.

Welcome to Miss Busson

I warmly welcome Miss Raquel Busson who will be teaching BG1 and BG2 for Integrated Studies. Miss Busson has come to us from the West Coast. She has already met some of her students during lockdown via lessons on zoom.

Thank you very much to Mrs Verge who taught these classes until Miss Busson could move here. We look forwards to having Mrs Verge back with us teaching English in Term 4, when she returns from maternity leave.

Delta Level 2

An email has already gone out to families outlining what Delta Level 2 looks like at school. Here is a recap of our main points:

- Face coverings are recommended if a student can wear them properly, but they are not mandatory
- Stay home if unwell. If a student becomes unwell during the day, they will be required to go home.
- Sanitizing and hand washing will become part of our routine
- Sharing of classroom equipment will be discouraged, so please check that your child has the correct stationery
- Drink fountains remain on during Level 2, however we encourage students to bring their own water bottle
- School lunches continue as normal. Canteen is open as normal.
- We recommend students bring their own device to school to eliminate the sharing of devices. An ICT agreement needs to be signed for a personal device to go onto our system. These are available from the school office.

Practice Exams

Our senior students will be completing Practice Exams during Term 4 Week 2 (26th – 29th October). These exams are very important as the grades may need to be used for derived grades. Senior students will be off timetable for those dates and will only attend school when they have an exam or a practical session. A confirmed timetable will be sent out shortly to students and parents. Exams will run from 9am-12pm and then from 1pm-4pm.

NCEA exams

NCEA exams for 2022 are now from Monday 22^{nd} November until Tuesday 14^{th} December. The exam timetable can be found on the NZQA website.

Senior finish date

Because NCEA exams have been rescheduled, seniors will now finish school on Friday 12th November. During the following week, some senior students will continue coming into school for tutorials or to finish practical classes. This will be arranged with individual students.

Last day of School

Our last day of school for 2021 is Monday 13th December. Y7-10 students will attend school for that day. All students (Y7-13) will attend our Awards Ceremony that evening from 7pm at the Temuka Stadium.

Course selections

An email has been sent home to all current Y10 – 13 students regarding choosing their subjects for 2022. It is important that this is completed by Friday 17^{th} September as we use this information to set our classes up for next year. If you are struggling with this or would like to sit down and discuss subject options, please get in contact with either your child's Dean or Vicki Henderson.

Our current Year 8 & 9 students will select their courses for 2022 during Term 4 as planned.

Sporting events

Unfortunately, the netball and basketball tournaments were cancelled this year due to Covid. We would like to acknowledge the hard work that coaches, managers, students and parents put into these teams with fundraising and training. We are crossing our fingers that the basketball finals still go ahead this Friday night since we are now in Level 2.

The Pleasant Point Primary Exchange for Y7 & 8 students has also been cancelled. Because schools are unable to have visitors onsite under Level 2, we cannot hold this sporting event until we get to Level 1.

Ski Trip

Yet another cancellation, is the ski trip to Mt Hutt. Mt Hutt is fully booked leading up the end of the year with existing bookings, and with Level 2 restrictions in place, they cannot accommodate our school. The money will remain in your account unless you request for it to be refunded by ringing the office.


