# The Sun Always Shines on Opihi College

We are very excited to inform you that Opihi College is in the middle of getting a 92kW Solar Power system installed. This system will have huge benefits for our school community and our planet.

With this system, we are expecting to obtain over 50% of the school's energy consumption. This will not only allow the school to save money on our power bills, which we will be able to redirect straight into students learning, but it will also have huge environmental benefits as all the energy is produced without emissions. For example, each year we will avoid the need for 13 tons of CO2 to be pumped into our atmosphere.

Beyond these obvious benefits, this system will also be used as a teaching tool with students learning about alternative energy sources firsthand. We are also aiming to track the energy produced with a display panel in reception to give us real-time data on how we are affecting our environment.



# Whanau Awhina Plunket online Babysitting Course

Plunket Education in Schools'

Babysitting Course is available for teenagers all over Aotearoa. This course is designed to give high school students the knowledge and skills to babysit children of all ages. It's written for first time babysitters; students don't need to have previous experience to enrol. The course ideal for students aged 14 and above and takes around 2-3 hours to complete.

Students work through nine sequential modules and on completion of the course and the final quiz will receive a certificate certified by Whanau Awhina Plunket to show employers that they have completed this course and are ready to babysit. As well as the certificate the students are sent a Babysitter's Manual that supports all the information they have learned in the course.

During the course the following topics are covered:

• the role of the babysitter, including the expectations of the families you are working for

• ages and stages of children from birth to school age, their basic needs and their care

• professional behaviour including your presentation

• how to engage with children of different ages, including activities for each age group and

behavioural information

• safety, including emergency situations, keeping yourself and the children safe, and basic first aid

how to get a babysitting job.
