

Positive Behaviour for Learning

At Opihi College we use the Positive Behaviour for Learning tool to help teach and reteach our school CARE values and to give our students those vital social emotional skills that will help them thrive and flourish at home, work and beyond.

We are excited to announce the launch of our Opihi College CARE Challenge for 2023. The school has three stages; Kākano/seedling - Year 7/8, Māhuri/ young plant - Year 9/10 and Köhure/mature plant -Year 11/13. The primary objective of this challenge is to 'help our students grow into well rounded individuals who are capable of setting goals and aiming high'. Students will have a range of different challenges to work towards. Some of these are: representing the school in cultural, sporting and creative events, demonstrating good citizenship, volunteering within our school and local community, academic awards, arriving at school on time, wearing the correct uniform, excellent pastoral record. For each challenge they achieve they will be awarded 1 or 2 points. By accumulating their points over the year or two years they will aspire to achieve their Bronze. Silver and Gold awards.

Please ask your tamariki all about the CARE challenge and ask them which one they would like to achieve first. Contact their whānau teacher if they complete a challenge at home or in the community so they can earn points.

Gateway

This year Gateway started with individual interviews and conversations to help us learn about their passions and aspirations and guide their Gateway placements for Term 2. Level 2 students have taken part in a two day first aid course and have a two day health and safety course this week. They will also have a fire and safety course towards that end of the term. Level 3 students have a more advanced health and safety course in March. These courses are essential to help prepare all students for workplace experiences. Recently, two students have started the ignition MITO course and two other students are about to start their Gateway BCITO course. We are extremely proud that Opihi can offer these opportunities.

This year our Careers department has navigated itself to the library. Every fortnight we send an Opihi Careers Hub newsletter to students and whanau from years 11-13. This newsletter is an interactive tool that contains links to courses, jobs and experiences within South Canterbury, Canterbury and at times nationally. It is exciting to know that we are able to keep students and whanau up to date and in the loop.

This year we have invested in a tool called My Mahi to help teach our careers unit. My Mahi contains many lessons that range from careers, personal finances, goals and organisation, learning and and social engagement. personal capability. relationships, sustainability and wellbeing. We are also using it to build their personal profiles, set goals, and create their CVs. We are really excited about this and we are looking forward to seeing how students work with teachers to help build relationships and share their strengths. Presently, all students from year 10 - 13 receive a careers lesson every Wednesday period 5. This term we have talks from University of Canterbury, BCITO, Otago University, ARA/Te Pukenga, Otago Polytech and Auckland University. This will allow all students to be fully informed. Letting the Community Dental Service know about any events or needs of children during our visit


Dental Service will be visiting Opíhí College from Monday 6th March



Free Dental Care for Children including special information regarding Year 8 students

One of our Community Dental Service vans will be making a visit to your school soon.

- Only the children who currently require a check-up will be seen at this visit.
- The dental therapist will provide a regular check-up and preventative care which may include: Cleaning/Scaling (to remove plaque from teeth)
 Dental x-rays (to check for decay in teeth, or presence and position of teeth) Fluoride Varnish (painted on teeth to help prevent decay) Fissure Sealants (coating put on teeth to prevent decay) if required.
- If your child requires any other dental care, they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain what dental care and appointment times are required.
- When you receive the 'Care Plan' please contact our Call Centre as soon as possible as you will need to arrange a time to bring your child to one of our Community Clinics for this dental care
- Please contact our Call Centre if you want further information on the Community Dental Service, to enrol your child or if you have any specific questions about your child's dental care (a dental therapist will call you back)
- Year 8 students: all year 8 students enrolled with the Community Dental Service are transferred from the Community Dental Service to a FREE private dentist from year 9 until their 18th birthday. To help with this transition please ensure you have informed your child of their family dentist (not orthodontist). This will enable us to transfer your child onto the correct dentist for year 9 onwards. More information will be sent home after their year 8 check-up.









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
