## CURRICULUM REFRESH DAY

The Ministry of Education have announced that all schools need to take two **Teacher Only Days** this year for curriculum refresh and implementation of the NCEA changes. We are given set timeframes for the Teacher Only Days, therefore on **Monday 1st May** we will be closed for instruction.

## PPTA STRIKE ACTION

The PPTA have advised Opihi College that, unless there is a resolution to their collective agreement negotiations, teaching staff will be continuing their industrial action in Term 2. The actions notified so far are as follows:

### Detail of the actions

- \* Continuing the relief ban from day one of term 2.
- \* Starting a ban on meetings outside school hours (8:30-4:30 or equivalent for the individual school) from day one of Term 2.
- \* A rolling one-day national strike in week three of term 2, with each region striking for a day as follows:  
**Tuesday 9 May** - Marlborough, Nelson, West Coast, Canterbury Aoraki, Otago, Southland

Following this there will be days when staff will be refusing to teach student year groups, which will mean there will be days when senior students will be rostered home. The following is the rostering home plan:

## ENROLMENT SCHEME IMPLEMENTATION AT OPIHI COLLEGE

In order to avoid a situation where our school has, or is likely to have, more applicants for enrolment than there are places available, the Board of Trustees of Opihi College has implemented an enrolment scheme which has been developed by the Secretary for Education, effective from 24<sup>th</sup> April 2023.

Under this scheme, first priority on enrolment places will be given to preference students for whom the school is reasonably convenient. A description of how 'reasonably convenient' is defined is contained in the scheme.

The enrolment of non-preference students is governed by the school's Integration Agreement. The enrolment scheme, which includes a description of the criteria that will apply to the selection of students in situations where there are more applications than there are places available, may be viewed on our website: [www.opihicollege.school.nz](http://www.opihicollege.school.nz), at the school office where copies of the scheme are available.
