PPTA INDUSTRIAL ACTION

The PPTA have advised Opihi College that, unless there is a resolution to their collective agreement negotiations, teaching staff will be continuing their industrial action in Term 2. The actions notified so far are as follows:

Detail of the actions

- * Continuing the relief ban from day one of term 2.
- * Starting a ban on meetings outside school hours (8:30-4:30 or equivalent for the individual school) from day one of Term 2.
- * A rolling one-day national strike in week three of term 2, with each region striking for a day as follows: **Tuesday 9 May -** Marlborough, Nelson, West Coast, Canterbury Aoraki, Otago, Southland

Following this there will be days when staff will be refusing to teach student year groups, which will mean there will be days senior students will be rostered home. The following is the rostering home plan:


SPRING BULB FUNDRAISER

CAREERS AND GATEWAY

During Term 1 our careers lessons for Year 10 - 13 focused on their strengths, weaknesses, passions and then adding this information to our new profiling system, called My Mahi. Within these lessons, students explored the concepts of careers and jobs, what employers are looking for, what are qualifications and the value of volunteering. Their objective is to be self reflective and add their thoughts to their profile, thus allowing this to build over time. The students were lucky to have visits from the University of Otago, University of Canterbury, Auckland University, University of Lincoln and Otago Polytechnic. These visits are crucial to all students as they contain informative and thought provoking ideas, particularly with the diverse choices of subjects, different types of halls and applying for scholarships. We sent ten students to Clandeboye Kindergarten during this time too. Next term our focus is to be more practical and look at vocations and industries.





Our level 2 and 3 Gateway Students have been very busy preparing for their term 2 and 3 placements. All level 2 students gained their First Aid certificate, Health and Safety certificate and Fire Safety certificate. Whilst our level 3 students completed a more progressive and challenging Health and Safety course.

During our lessons the level 2 students completed their targeted CV unit standard and the level 3 students are preparing to interview as part of their final section of their unit standard. We have students starting their MITO course, one will be at the mechanical workshop at Fonterra, the other will be working at Bairds Motordrome. Another two students have begun a BCITO course and will be working with two local builders, Joyce Building and Hines Building. Other placements for next term consist of graphic design at Artikel and Swint, hospitality at SubWay and primary teaching at Winchester School. Two students will be completing a service IQ course with The Warehouse. I also took five students to Fonterra for a tour with the possibility of completing a ten week placement within lots of different departments.







Part of our role is to advise students and help them make the right decision and this term we have taken two students to Ara in Timaru. One is currently completing a full time mechanical and automotive course, whilst the other is still considering their options.







Towards the end of term we took our Year 12 students to Levels Raceway to participate in a RYDA course. This course is designed to inform students about the importance of safe driving and making the right choice.

We also have our career wise newsletter that we send to whanau of Year 11 - 13 every fortnight. This is full of local and national courses, advice and many job opportunities. We hope that you find this informative and helpful.

At Opihi College we are proud of the many different opportunities that are available and we continue to work hard to ensure all students are exposed to a wide range of vocations.
