
#### RECORDS FALL AT OPIHI COLLEGE CROSS **COUNTRY**

# Awards throughout the year

We have various awards that are given out to our Year 9 & 10's at the end of each term, and our Year 7 & 8's at the end of each semester. The Year 7 & 8's complete six 'option' classes during the year, so we have broken the year into "semesters" for them and they do two classes a semester. They are due to begin their new semester on Monday  $22^{nd}$  May.

The awards that are given out are "Outstanding Attainment", "Merit" or "Endeavour".

**Outstanding Attainment** – is awarded to the student who achieves the highest academic grade in that class, if it is an above average grade.

**Merit** – is awarded to the student who achieves second highest academic score in that class.

**Endeavour** – is awarded to the student/s who have worked consistently inside (and outside) of class. There is only a certain percentae of students from a class that can be awarded Endeavour.

# **Bike Safety**

On Thursday in assembly we were joined by Bob Katene from the Temuka Police. He talked to the students about bike safety and some of the concerns that they have.

One concern which he talked about was students not wearing a helmet. It is law that if anyone is riding a bike, they wear a helmet. He said that he will now notify the local police to say that he has given everyone a warning, and if they see people not wearing helmets they are to issue a caution notice, followed by a fine.

The second concern is around how some students are riding their bikes. Bikes need to be ridden on the left hand side of the road and with both wheels on the ground. It is about keeping our community safe. That includes our cyclists and also the motorists who are driving past at the same time.

If your child cycles to school, it would be great if you could reinforce this same message.

### **ILLNESS**

Our community is currently experiencing higher levels of illness, including COVID infections.

A friendly reminder that we comply with current guidelines which advise that if your child tests positive for COVID they must self isolate for seven days. Your Household Contacts do not need to isolate. They should test daily for 5 days. If they test positive, they need to begin 7 days of isolation as someone with COVID-19. Household contacts of COVID patients, and asymptomatic may attend school as long as they have a negative COVID test each day. If you require, COVID test kits are available free of charge from the Temuka District Library. We appreciate your assistance with preventing the spread of illness.
