# **ENROLMENT AT OPIHI COLLEGE FOR 2024**

The board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Opihi College for next year. Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

Application for enrolment can be made online (please visit the Opihi College website) or by completing hard copy forms available at our school office.

The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is **15 October 2023**. This includes students applying to be treated as in-zone students under transition provisions. Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

The board has determined that 5 places are likely to be available for out-of-zone students next year. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required it will be held **24 October 2023**.

Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

# PRACTICE EXAMS / TIMETABLE

From Tuesday 12th September to Friday 15th September, we are holding our practice exam/assessment week for our Year 11-13 students. These assessments are very important as it is what we use for derived grades should a student miss their end of year exam. During this week it is also the time for students to complete large practical based assessments as well.

Year 11-13 students are off timetable for this week and will only come into school during their practice exam or scheduled practical time. When they come into school, they will need to sign in at the office and sign out when they leave. This is so we know who is onsite. Students will come in full school uniform. If they are a bus student and need to be on-site for the whole day, they will go to the Library to do independent study. Their usual teachers will not be available during their usual timetabled classes as they may be getting used for exam supervision or other class cover. School lunches for seniors will be available from the school library after 11am. The exam and practical session timetable has been emailed to all senior students and parents.

## SENIORS FINISH DATE

Senior students will finish on Friday 27th October (end of Week 3). NCEA exams run from Monday 6th November to Thursday 30th November and are run on school site.

#### LITERACY AND NUMERACY

The next round of the Literacy and Numeracy Common Assessment Activities (CAA's) are scheduled to take place during the week of 30th October – 3rd November. All Year 10 students who do not have Literacy and Numeracy have been entered into these CAA's. There are 3 assessments - Numeracy worth 10 credits, Reading worth 5 credits and Writing worth 5 credits. In order for students to gain an NCEA qualification, they must have 10 Numeracy and 10 Literacy credits. The CAA's is one way to gain these credits. The other way is through approved standards in 2024 and 2025 only. If a student does not pass the CAA, they will be allowed to attempt it as many times as they wish. We are hoping that in 2024, NZQA will set 3 CAA assessment opportunities but we are still waiting for that confirmation.

# SENIOR SUBJECT SELECTION

All current Year 10-12 students who are returning next year should have made their course selections for 2024 by now. Following that, we set the subjects into "lines" and we will get back to students if they need to reselect because their choices clash. If you have any concerns with course selection, please get in contact with your child's Dean.
