From Across the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents/Caregivers Kia ora tatou

NCEA external assessments have been continuing and we have just one week left until we are finished for another year. A number of students have continued to attend school for tutorials and to complete internal assessments. It is wonderful that so many of our students receive the help and support from their teachers. This is one of the great attributes of Opihi College, where students have easy and ready access to their teachers to improve the learning and outcomes for the individual student.

For the junior school it has been business as normal. During the last two weeks there have been a number of activities set up for students. Again these are great opportunities for our community.

Educational opportunities

At this time of year many students are considering their options for their future. We know that some students do look to see what is available at other schools. In the last year a small number of students did start the school year at other schools and then returned to Opihi College. 
MAKE-UP






NEW CRICKET WICKET
